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# Ride Leaders Return

The NFBC is "easing back to normal".

Beginning Saturday, May 22, some rides will have ride leaders depending on the availability of volunteers. Members are invited to volunteer to lead <u>weekend</u> rides by signing up on the NFBC Website or by emailing Liz Skelton or Pat Danaher directly. At this time, "lead" means: hand out cue sheets, identify/ mentor any new riders and generally be the point of contact for the ride.

Weekday rides will continue to be led by the dedicated leaders according to their comfort level with the situation. Check the NFBC Website for posted rides, download your own cue sheet in case one is not provided and show up to ride.

Note that there will be no sign in sheets except for guests, consequently no mileage will be recorded for this season.

# The Dunkirk Contingent

If you've attended an NFBC Spring or Fall General Meeting in past years, you may have noticed a small group of senior Club members tucked into a table in the back corner of the room. They are all from the Dunkirk-Fredonia region of WNY, and I have dubbed them The NFBC Dunkirk Contingent. They are: Bob Ehrheart, Bill Lotfus, Brad Russell and George Sinclair.

They don't show up for a lot of our local rides (it's an hour south of Buffalo to Dunkirk-Fredonia, and Brad is from Findley Lake which is another hour south of D-F) but they ride a lot as a group, and have done so for many years. In a conversation with Bob Ehrheart, he filled me in on how this little group came together. In 2008, Bob did a Red Cross fundraising ride out of Fredonia State (50 mi) and ate lunch after the ride with a small group of riders. Later that summer on a Club trip to Providence RI, Bob met up with Brad, who had heard about the trip and subsequently joined NFBC and did the trip. Bill and Bob met through a mutual friend. George and Bob used to work together at Nestle-Purina in Dunkirk. After a layoff separated them, they became re-acquainted at a charitable cycling organization called Spoke Folk (website link below).

The four friends started taking cycling trips in 2013 with a ride along the Great Allegheny Passage, a rails-to-trails path which connects Pittsburgh PA and Washington DC. It was a one way, 333 mile trip which the guys completed in a eight days, staying in motels along the way. Once in DC, they boarded a train with their bikes to return to Pittsburgh. Sounds perfect!

The group has also biked the coast of Maine (2014) starting in New Hampshire and travelling north to Bar Harbor. In 2015 they did the Nova Scotia Club trip with Lepies, and in 2017 George, Bob and Bill did a North Country ride: They started in Watertown and rode to Saranac Lake, then went north to Malone, NY before heading back west along the St Lawrence River (~300 miles); they used a sag wagon which they took turns driving. In 2018 they tried an Adirondacks trip with the Adirondack Mountain Club but found it disorganized and disappointing (ADK is primarily a hiking and backpacking club) so they headed to the Williamsburg PA area for a trip later that year. In 2019, the 50th anniversary of the Woodstock NY festival, the group headed to Woodstock, Ontario where Dave Bowman and Dennis Powell joined them for four days of rides in that area (ref "Tourism Oxford" jturner@oxfordcounty.ca).



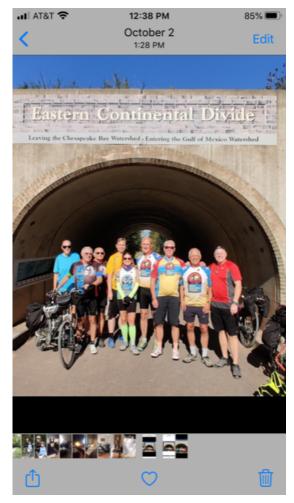
## The Dunkirk Contingent, continued

Bob says their favorite place to cycle so far has been in Virginia, because there is so much to see and do there. And the least favorite cycling? Bob says that the third day of cycling in Maine was memorable for being so much work, with 50 miles of constant hills.

And the most exciting incident? It was both good and bad: during the first trip in 2013, Bill lost control, crashed and suffered a concussion. The driver immediately behind the group stopped, called 911 and stayed with Bill and Bob for the next eight hours while Bill was in hospital. Once Bill was checked out and discharged, the good samaritan driver, Cindy, and the group had dinner together and she became a friend. In 2017, Bob, Bill and Brad did a round trip ride on the Chesapeake & Ohio Canal (on the north bank of the Potomac) to attend Cindy's 50th birthday party.

When I asked Bob about lessons learned in his many years in the saddle, he told me that patience is what he recommends to get the most out of your cycling experience. "Stop and Smell the Roses" he says. The group's plans for a postpandemic trip? They are targeting a ride along the Erie Canal for September, 2021.

The Dunkirk Contingent rides together between trips, too. They meet for a breakfast ride about once a week, eating at Jack's Drive In in Barcelona, NY. Occasionally they meet in Finlay Lake near Brad's house for a ride, and sometimes they ride the trails near Oil City in Franklin, PA (a two-hour drive



from D-F). This group (all but youngster George are in their 80's), are still pretty active and average 1400-1500 miles on their bikes per season. We should all be so lucky to be able to do that!

Next time you see them at a General Meeting, go over and introduce yourself to one of the most inspirational groups in our NFBC family.

If someone has volunteered to lead the ride, cue sheets should be available at the ride start location/time.

### How Do We Do That Again?

Recently I spent some time showing a new member how to find and print ride cues from the NFBC website. It's easy to forget how to do that so, here's a refresher:

Weekend rides:

- 1. Click SCHEDULE on the banner at the top of the NFBC website home page. All the posted weekend rides will automatically show up.
- 2. Choose your ride and click on the NAME of the ride, and the MAP page shows up. Scroll down to see the route mapped out and the cues to the right of the map.
- 3. Above the map and to the right, click on MAP CUES. A printable PDF of the map and cue sheet will appear.

Weekday rides:

- 1. Click SCHEDULE on the banner at the top of the NFBC website home page.
- 2. Click RIDE SEARCH OPTIONS.
- 3. Click the down arrow in the Ride Type box.
- 4. Click Recurring and Weekend Rides
- 5. Click SEARCH

Now ALL scheduled rides appear. Choose the day/time/location you want, and click on the NAME of the ride. The MAP page shows up. Scroll down to see the route mapped out and the cues to the right of the map.

At this point you can either click on the small blue box below the map which says "Download Excel" if you have Excel on your device, and then print as usual. Or you can copy the cues which appear to the right of the map, paste them into any kind of spreadsheet file and print.

However, weekday leaders are often kindly provide cue sheets to riders at the start of their rides.

In consideration of being permitted to participate in any way in the NFBC sponsored bicycling activity, I for myself, my personal representatives, assigns, heirs, and next of kin:

1. ACKNOWLEDGE, agree and represent that I understand the nature of this bicycling activity, and that I am qualified, in good health, and in proper physical condition to participate in such activity, I further acknowledge that the activity will be conducted over public roads and facilities open to the public during the activity and upon which the hazards of travelling are to be expected. I further agree and warrant that if at any time I believe conditions to be unsafe, I will immediately discontinue further participation in the activity.

2. FULLY UNDERSTAND that (a) bicycling activities involve risks and dangers of serious bodily injury, including permanent disability, paralysis and death; (b) these risks and dangers may be caused by my own actions or inactions, the actions or inactions of others participating in the activity, the conditions in which the activity takes place, or the negligence of the releasees named below; (c) there may be other risks and social and economic losses whether not known to me or not readily foreseeable at this time; and I fully accept and assume all such risks and all responsibility for losses, costs and damages I incur as a result of my participation in this activity.

3. HEREBY RELEASE, discharge and covenant not to sue the NFBC, the LAB, their respective administrators, directors, agents, officers, volunteers and employees, other participants, any sponsors, advertisers, and if applicable, owners and lessers of premises on which the activity takes place, from all liability, claims, demands, losses or damages on my account caused or alleged to be caused in whole or in part by the negligence of the releasees or otherwise, including negligent rescue operations; and I further agree that if, despite this release and waiver of liability, assumption of risk, and indemnity agreement, I, or anyone on my behalf, makes a claim against any of the releasees, I will indemnify, save, and hold harmless each of the releasees from any litigation expenses, attorney fees, loss, liability, damage or cost which may occur as the result of such claim.
