Overheard:

"Bicycling is a very simple solution to many complicated problems in the world." --- **John Burke**, Trek president, announcing a 3-year, \$600,000+ advocacy program dubbed "One World, Two Wheels" intended to eventually increase trips by bike from 1% to 5% in the U.S.



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TRY THIS ON YOUR NEXT RIDE Max your mo on successive short hills!

Most riders can find a road where little hills come one after another.

When you feel good, attacking these humps can be a peak experience -- like riding a roller coaster. You fly up one side, blast down the other and use your momentum to conquer the next rise.

But if you use improper technique, you can get bogged down. Instead of grinning, you're grinding. You churn up, coast down to catch your breath, then bang against the next wall.

Rhythm is everything. Try this to keep yours on successive climbs:

As you ride into a hill that takes just seconds to climb, shift one gear lower (next larger cog) than you might normally use. Stay seated and spin fast for about two thirds of the climb.

If you're riding with others, they'll probably be standing, pedaling slower than you and maybe pulling a little ahead. Don't worry about getting dropped. Keep spinning. You're saving your legs.

In the final third of the hill, click to a bigger gear (next smaller cog), stand and apply the pressure. Your legs will still have snap, thanks to spinning to this point. When you hit it right, you'll know where the phrase "dancing up the hill" comes from.

You'll roll right by your laboring companions. Even better, your momentum will carry you over, down and well into the next rise. Then do it again.

OFFICIAL PARTY RULES

For members of the NFBC, biking is number one, followed by socializing with friends. Get-togethers are organized by volunteers in the club who enjoy hosting parties. Take a right on Wilson-Burt and a quick left on North Beebe. Turn right onto Lake Road. Singer Farms will be on your right and Woodland Road is the next left. This is about a 30 minute ride from the UB area of Amherst.

(From the West, Grand Island/Niagara Falls area) Take 104 East to Beebe Road. Turn left and follow the directions from asterisk above. About a 30 minute ride from GI...

Positive results from the Tour de France

No, not that kind of "positive." For a change this isn't about drug testing. It's reported that the Tour's prologue in London has inspired a thousand city inhabitants to begin using bikes for transportation. According to bikeradar.com, there are now about 480,000 bike trips across London each day and the number of cyclists in the capital has increased by 83% since 2000. Mayor Ken Livingstone's goal is a 400% increase in bike

trips by 2025. Meanwhile, half a world away in Australia, a bike boom is underway, in part credited to recent Aussie successes in the Tour. As Cadel Evans' rode to second place in the most recent edition, the race's TV audience shot up 27% compared to 2006. Bike clubs are growing, bike sales are up to 1.2 million per year, and professional people are said to be choosing cycling over golf for networking.

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
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
